It matters what stories make worlds, what worlds make stories.“ (Haraway, 2016, S. 12)

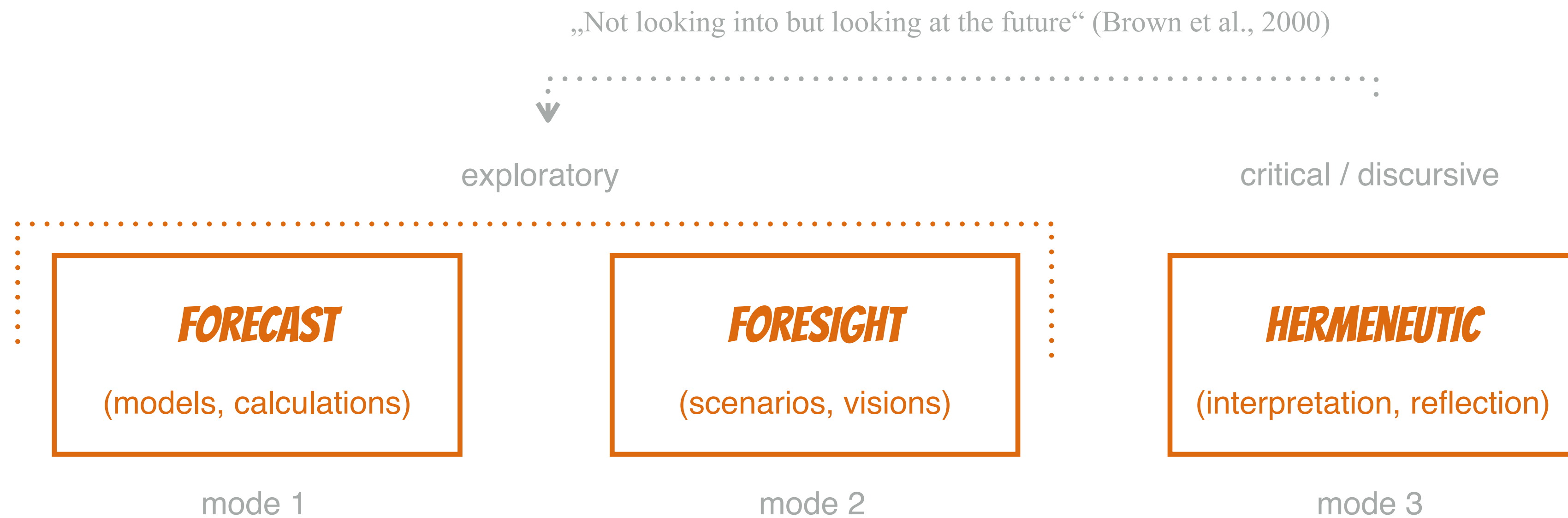
Die Pluralisierung der Zukunft

- ▶ *Zukunft* ist ein „Warenhaus an Möglichkeiten“ (Luhmann, 1990, p. 120)
- ▶ *Zukunft* unterschieden in...
 - ▶ **Zukünftige Gegenwart** – als ein Moment später als jetzt.
 - ▶ **Gegenwärtigen Zukünften** – als gegenwärtige Vorstellungen möglicher zukünftiger Gegenwarten.

Umgang mit Unsicherheiten

- ▶ Risikogesellschaft und Modernisierungsrisiken (Beck, 1986)
 - ▶ Technologien haben Folgen, die sich negativ auf Gesellschaft und Umwelt auswirken können
- ▶ Technologische Pfade werden durch Handlungen und Entscheidungen geprägt
 - ▶ z. B. von Politikern, Investoren, Ingenieuren, Unternehmern und anderen
- ▶ Bedarf an **Orientierungswissen**, um aktuelle Maßnahmen und Entscheidungen zu unterstützen.

Dekonstruktion von Zukünften

„So mode 3 orientation is about trying to **learn something about ourselves, our societal practices, subliminal concerns, implicit hopes and fears** from the diversity and divergence of futures studies. Of course: first, to this end futures have to be interpreted or even **‚deconstructed‘** accordingly which calls for adequate assessment procedures and for hermeneutic effort.“ (Grunwald, 2014, p. 7)

Technikzukünfte...

- ▶ ... sind **mediale Darstellungen von Zukunftswelten**, in denen projizierte Formen der Technologie eine zentrale Rolle spielen und die Gesellschaft oder die Umwelt prägen.
- ▶ ... sind **soziale Texte** und Träger von kulturell geteilten Imaginären. Sie können dechiffriert werden und verweisen damit auf etwas anderes, das jenseits der Technologie liegt.
- ▶ ... haben **soziotechnische Auswirkungen**, da sie, obwohl sie fiktional sind, technologische Prozesse durch Diskurse und Visionen prägen und Leitbilder für die Entwicklung der Technologien bereit stellen.

Future studies as Imaginary studies

(Imaginationsforschung)

Wolfgang Iser

- ▶ „Das Imaginäre also machte Karriere und hat seither Konjunktur, was sich nicht zuletzt darin ausdrückt, daß man es in den verschiedensten Bereichen (...) zu einer Art **materia prima** gesteigert hat. Begriffe wie **Ur-Phantasie** oder ein primärer *état imaginaire* – die heute in der Diskussion eine Rolle spielen – lassen erkennen, **daß das Imaginäre einen Endhorizont verkörpert, von dem her gedacht wird.**“ (Iser, 1993, S. 351)



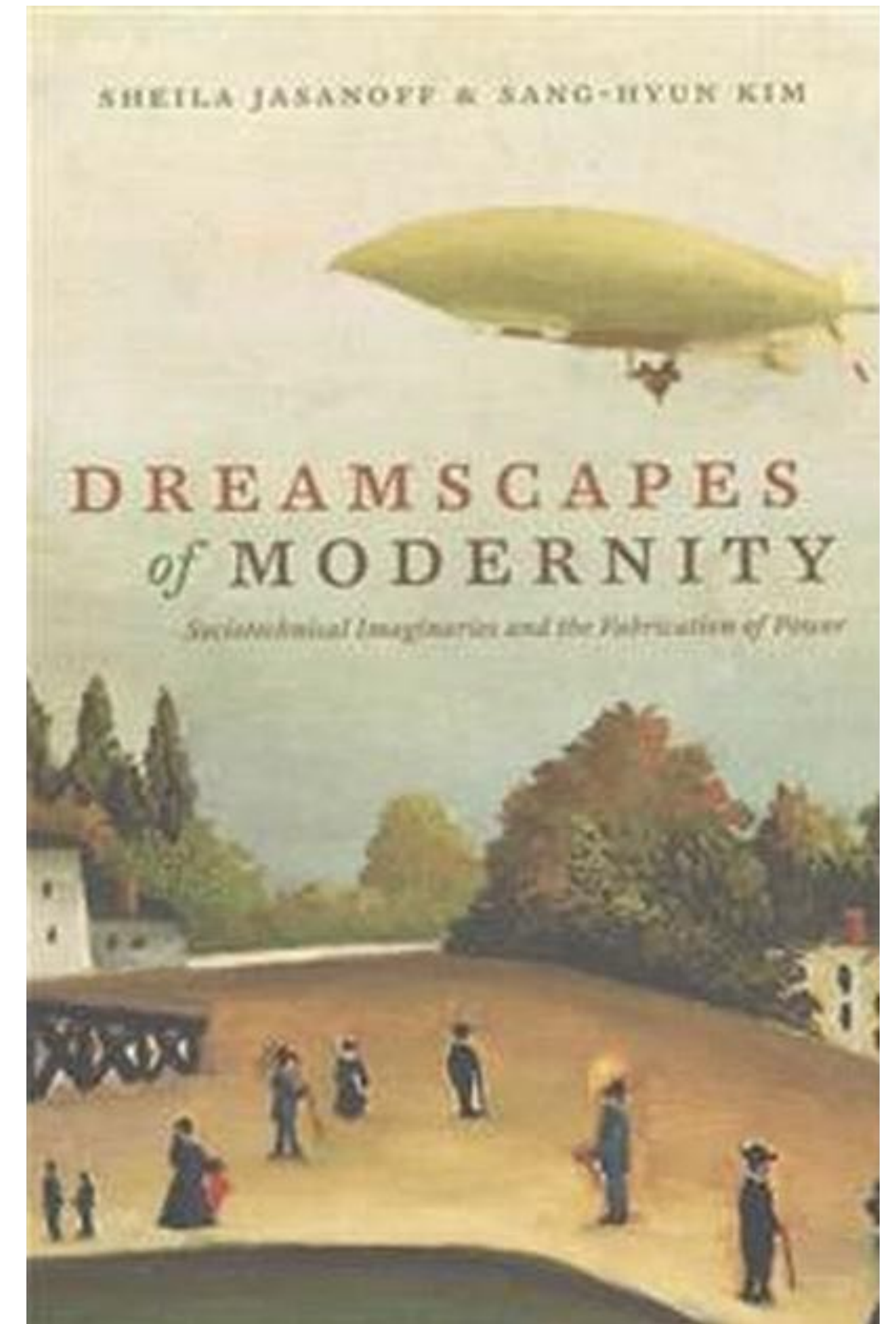
Cornelius Castoriadis

- ▶ „The imaginary of which I am speaking is not an image of. It is the unceasing and essentially undetermined (social-historical and psychical) creation of figures/forms/images, on the basis of which alone there can ever be a question of ‘something’. **What we call ‘reality’ and ‘rationality’ are its works.**“ (Castoriadis, 1975, S. 3)
- ▶ **Social imaginary signifiers:** the phenomenon by which human cultures come to posit a thing as standing in for something that it is not, for example, a sword as symbol of sovereign power.
 - ▶ The imaginary in this example is „sovereign power“ as the way to structure a society.
 - ▶ The signifier is the sword, that refers to the imaginary of sovereign power



Sheila Jasanoff & Sang-Hyun Kim

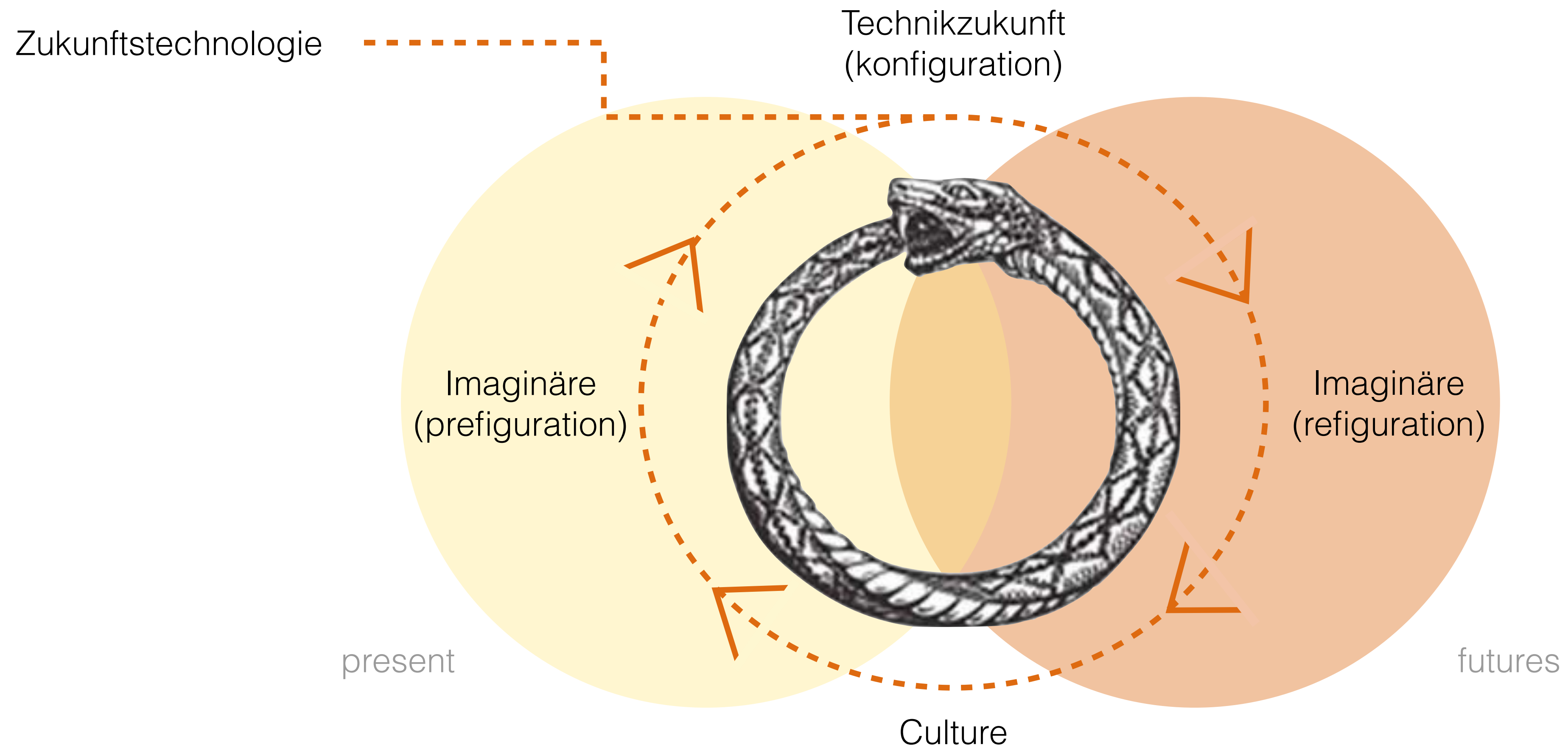
- ▶ „**Sociotechnical imaginaries** [are] collectively held, institutionally stabilized, and publicly performed visions of desirable futures, animated by shared understandings **of forms of social life and social order attainable through**, and supportive of, advances in **science and technology.**“ (Jasanoff & Kim, 2015, p. 4)
- ▶ „Science Fiction is **a repository of sociotechnical imaginaries**, visions that integrate futures of growing knowledge and technological mastery with normative assessments of what such futures could and should mean for present-day societies.“
(Jasanoff & Kim, 2015, S. 337)



Mimetische Kreislauf (Ricoeur, 1984 - 1986)

- ▶ „A narrative text is (1) **prefigured** by its cultural context with its specific symbolic order. It (2) **configures** extra-literary elements (the ‘real’ and the ‘imaginary’) into an exemplary temporal and causal order. In the act of reading, finally, the narrative composition is actualised. It becomes part of the symbolic order of a cultural formation, which is thereby (3) **refigured** and – here the circle closes functions in turn as the source of narrative preunderstanding on the level of mimesis I.“ (Erll, 2010, p. 93)

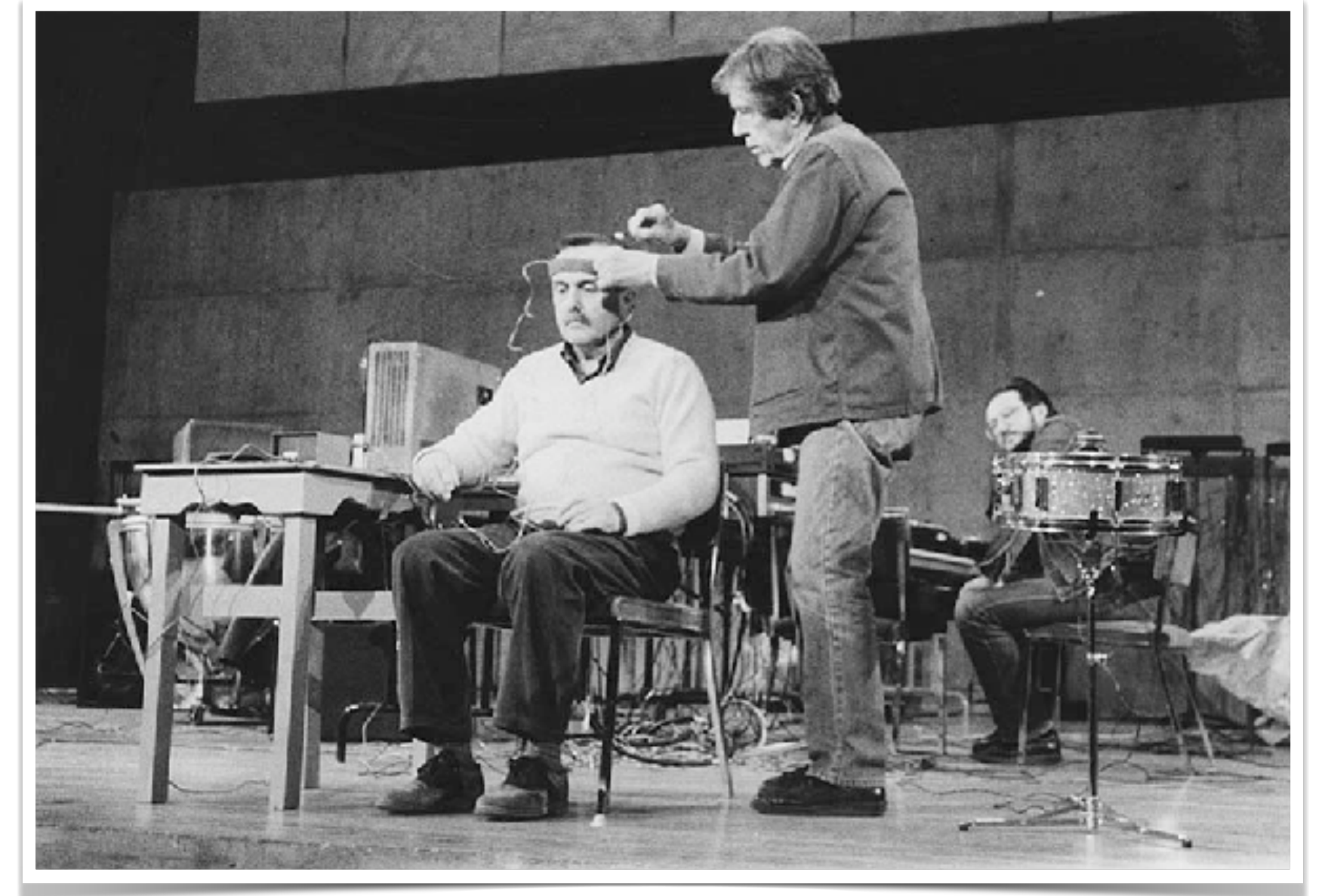

Neurointerface

- ▶ aka Brain-Machine Interface oder Brain-Computer-Interface
- ▶ Funktion:
 - ▶ misst das Aktionspotenzial im Gehirn
 - ▶ Überträgt die Signale an einen Computer
 - ▶ Verschiedene Formen (z.B. invasiv oder nicht-invasiv)

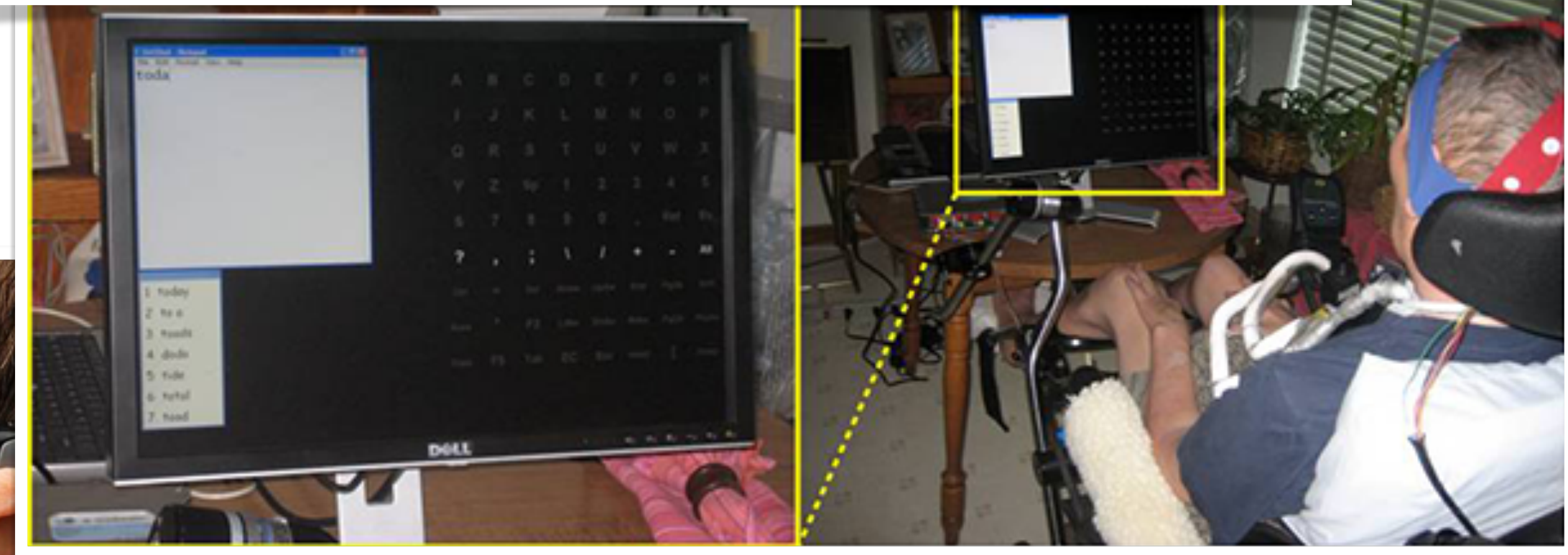


Alvin Lucier – Music for solo Performer (Lucier, 1965)



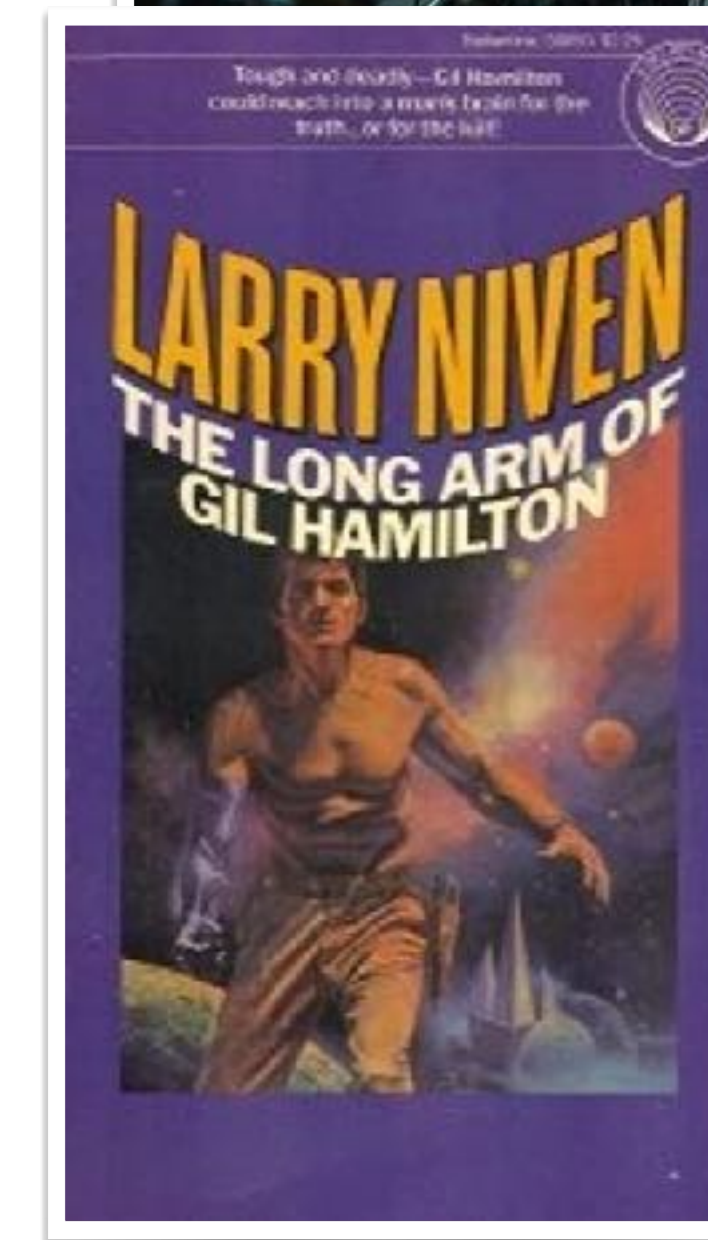
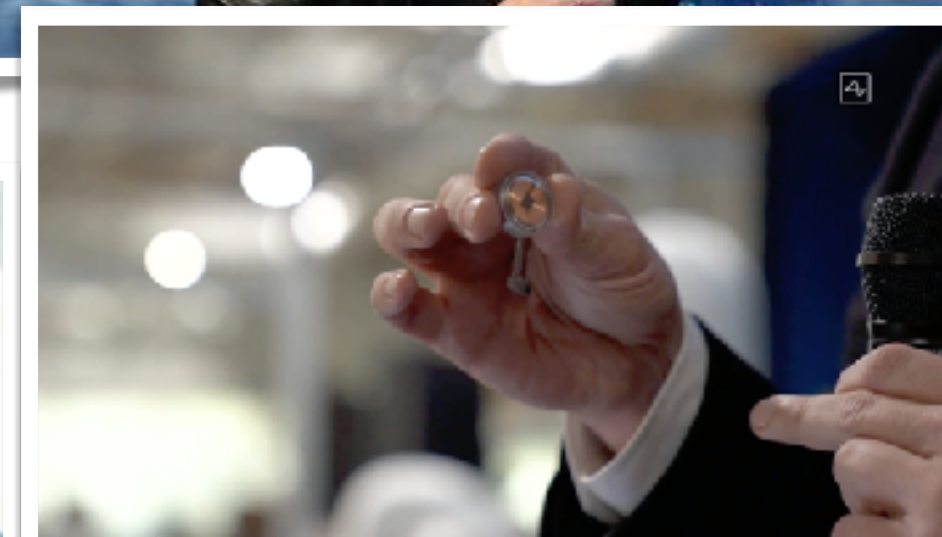
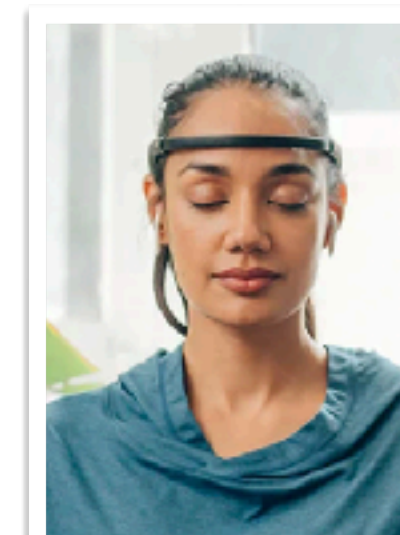

- ▶ *There will always be people who cavil this: ‚How do the dead rise again? Or with what manner of body shall they come?‘ (Corinthians 15:35)*

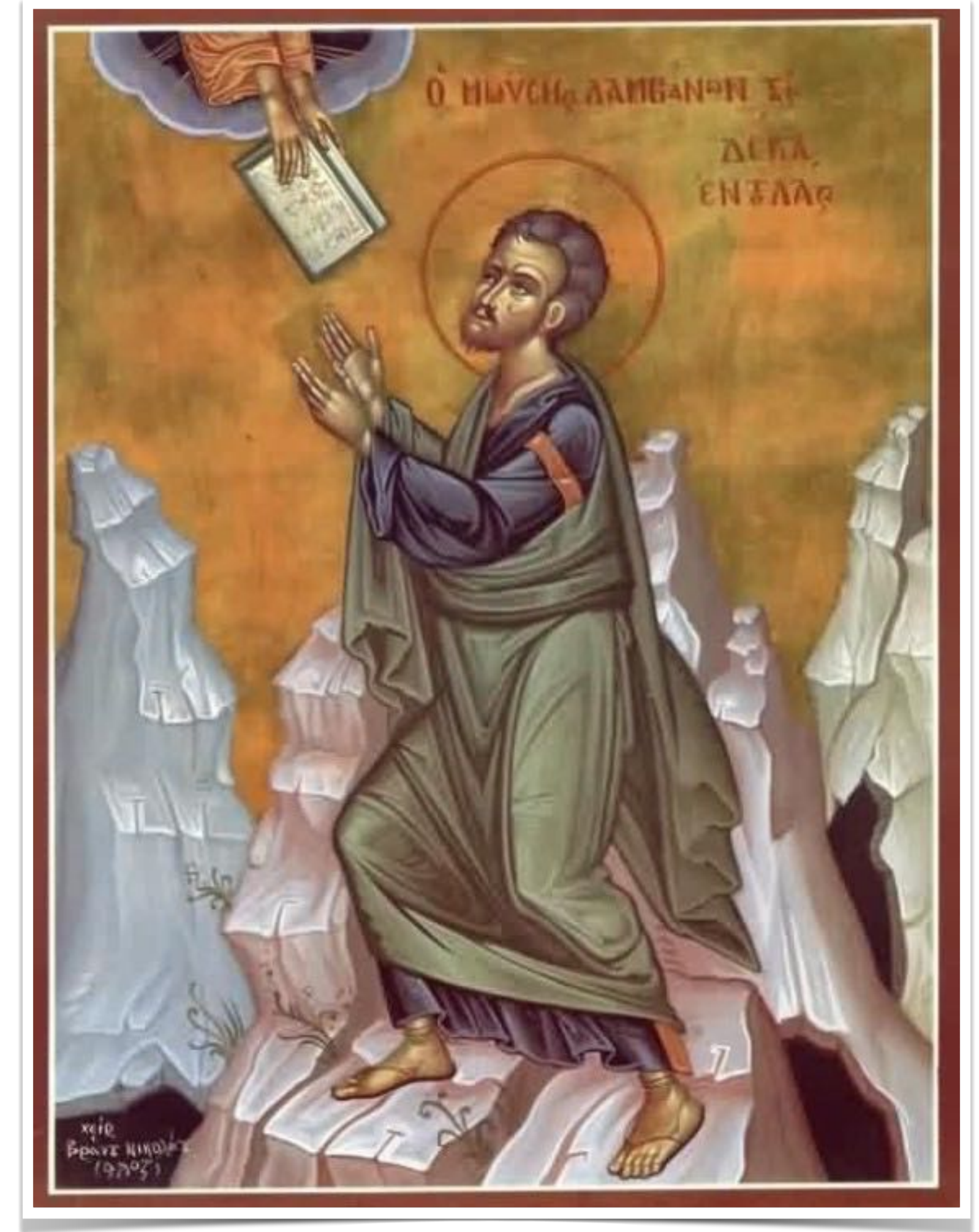

Spekulative Eschatologie

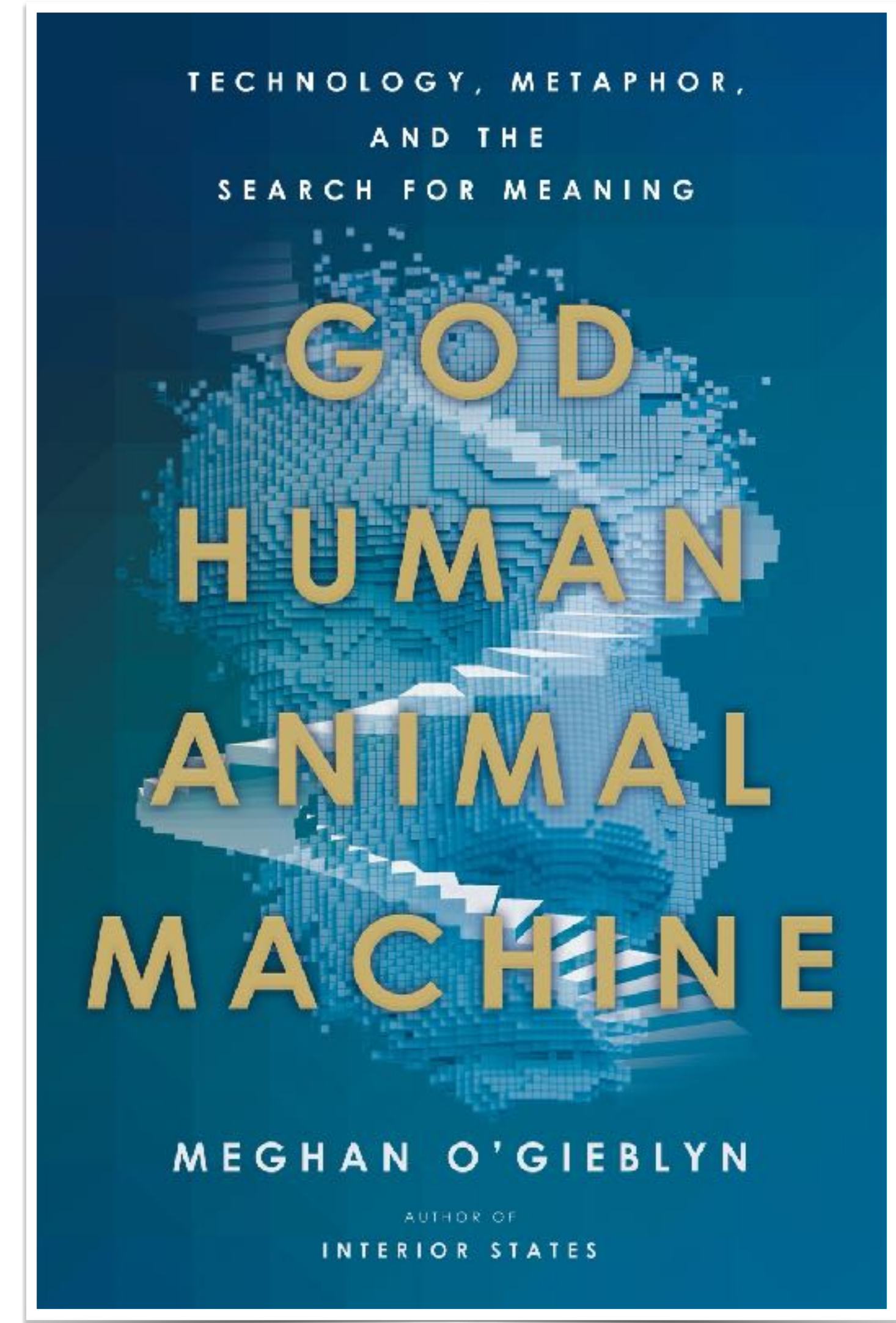
- ▶ „No question was too trivial for the early Church fathers: Will we all be the same sex in heaven? Will aborted fetuses rise? Will conjoined twins be two people or one in the afterlife? Will our resurrected bodies need food and sleep? Will the hair we cut and the nails we clipped over the course of our lives be returned to us in resurrection?“ (O’Gieblyn, 2021, p. 59)

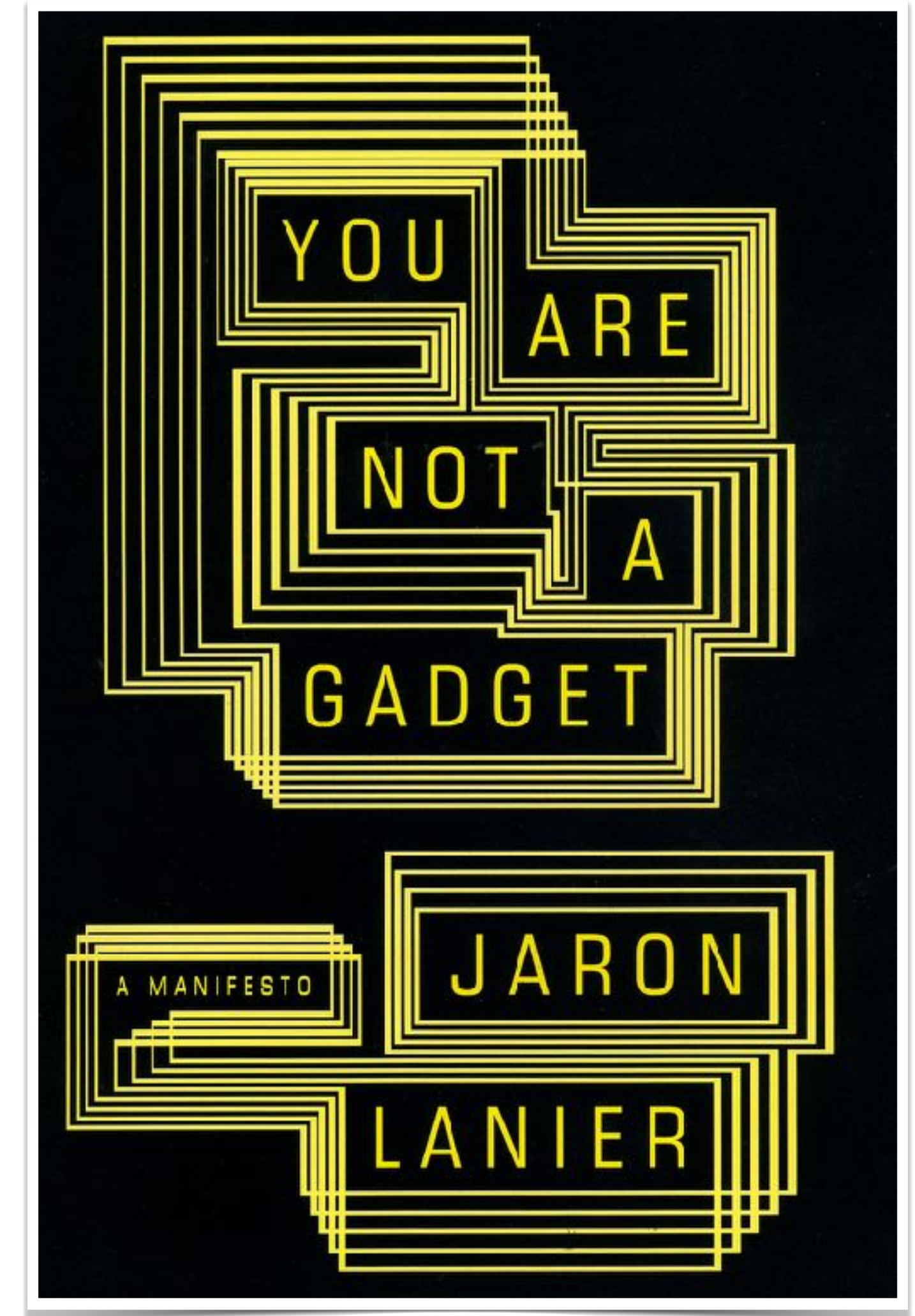
Upload in die Cloud

- ▶ Christliche Mythologie als Präfiguration des Mind-Uploads
- ▶ „Dante dramatizes the Resurrection by imagining that it will be like to be given a glorified body. After completing his journey through Paradise and ascending into the spheres of heaven, **he describes the process by which his human flesh is transformed.** (...) In the end he is forced to make an entirely new word *transhumanar*.“ (p. 53)

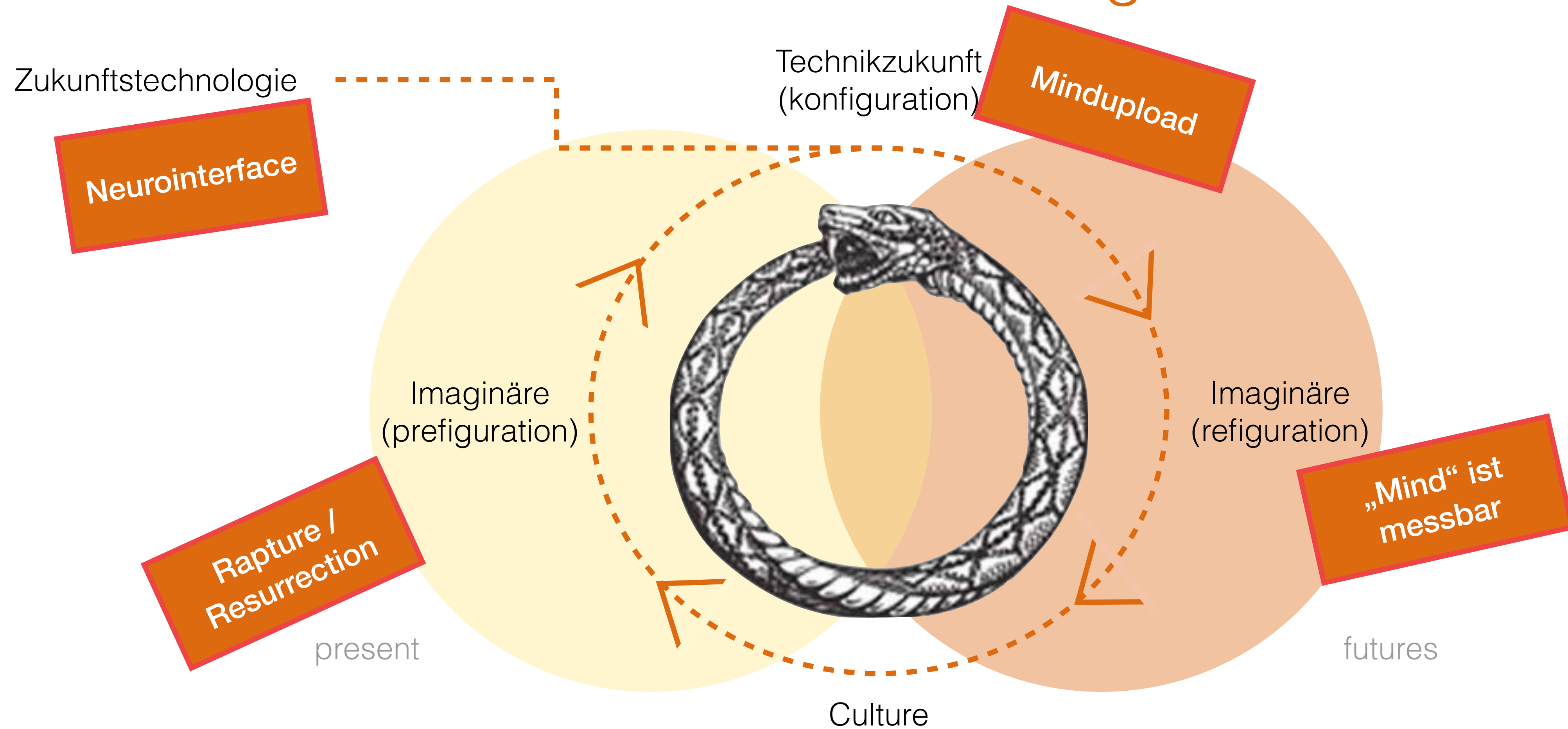


Refiguration des Geistes

- ▶ Technomorphisierung des menschlichen Körpers
- ▶ „But if you want to make the **transition from the old religion**, where you hope God will give you an afterlife, **to the new religion**, where you hope to become immortal by getting uploaded into a computer, then you have to believe **information is real and alive.**“ (p. 23)
- ▶ Das Neurointerface kann den Geist messen, somit ist der Geist das, was das Neurointerface messen kann.

Zwei Imaginäre des Minduploads

▶ **Exkavierender Scan:**

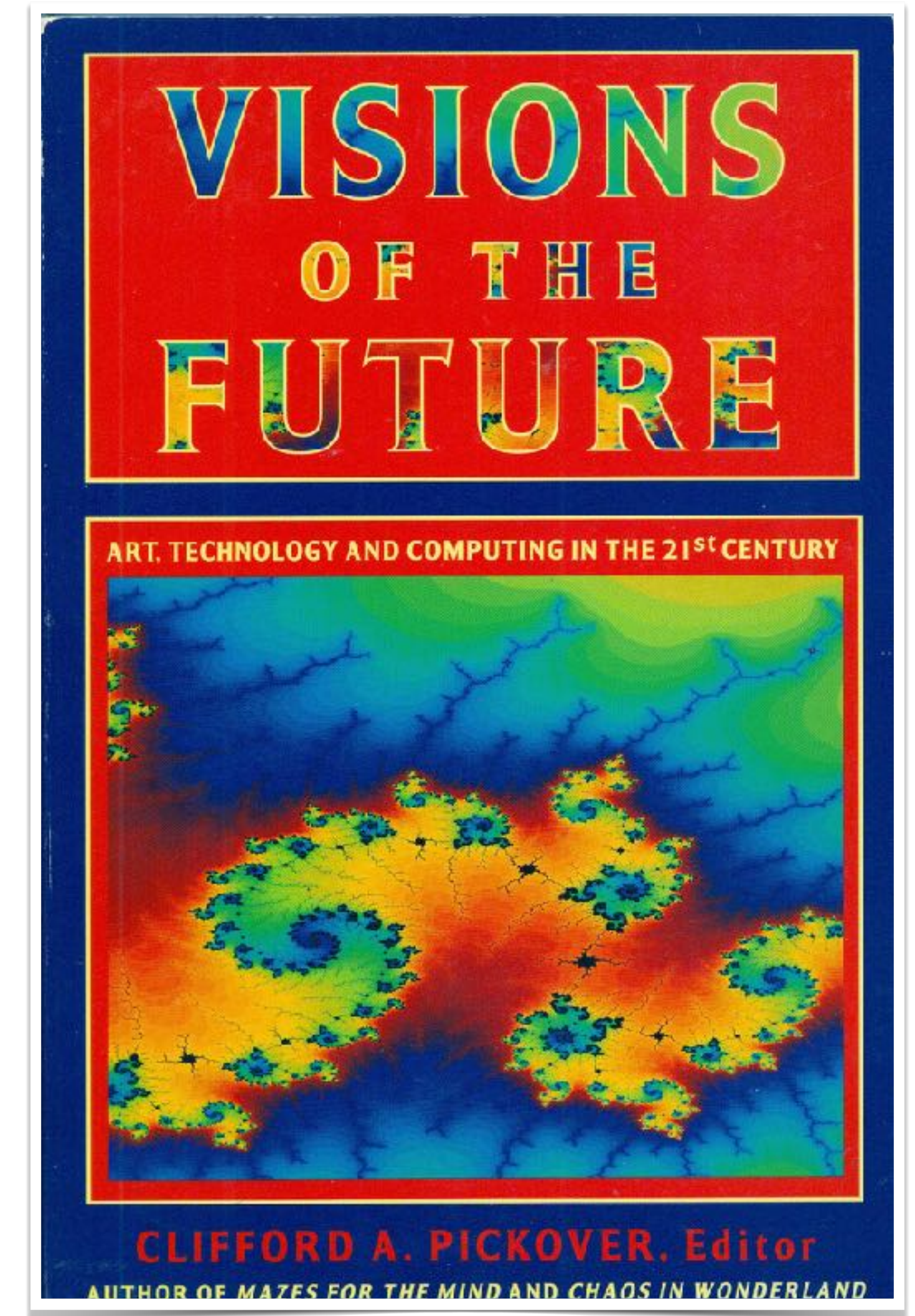
- ▶ Analysiert das Konnektom des Gehirns, dafür wird das Gehirn Schicht für Schicht abgetragen.
- ▶ Die Person stirbt bei dem Prozess. Erst danach kann die Struktur des Gehirns auf einem Computer nachgebildet werden.

▶ **Elektromagnetische Scans:**

- ▶ Nicht-Invasiv: MRT-ähnliche Geräte (die erst noch erfunden werden müssen), damit eine Person eine Kopie ihres Bewusstseins erstellen kann, während sie noch lebt.
- ▶ Invasiv: Neuronale Elektroden, welche die Impulse zwischen den Neuronen messen und dadurch die Gehirnaktivitäten nachahmen können.

Cut and Paste (Moravec, 1991)

"Layer after layer the brain is simulated, **then excavated**. Eventually your skull is empty, and the surgeon's hand rests deep in your brainstem. Though you have not lost consciousness, or even your train of thought, **your mind has been removed from the brain and transferred to a machine**. In a final, disorienting step the surgeon lifts its hand. **Your suddenly abandoned body dies**. For a moment you experience only quiet and dark. Then, once again, you can open your eyes. Your perspective has shifted. The computer simulation has been disconnected from the cable leading to the surgeon's hand and reconnected to a shiny new body of the style, color, and material of your choice. **Your metamorphosis is complete.**"



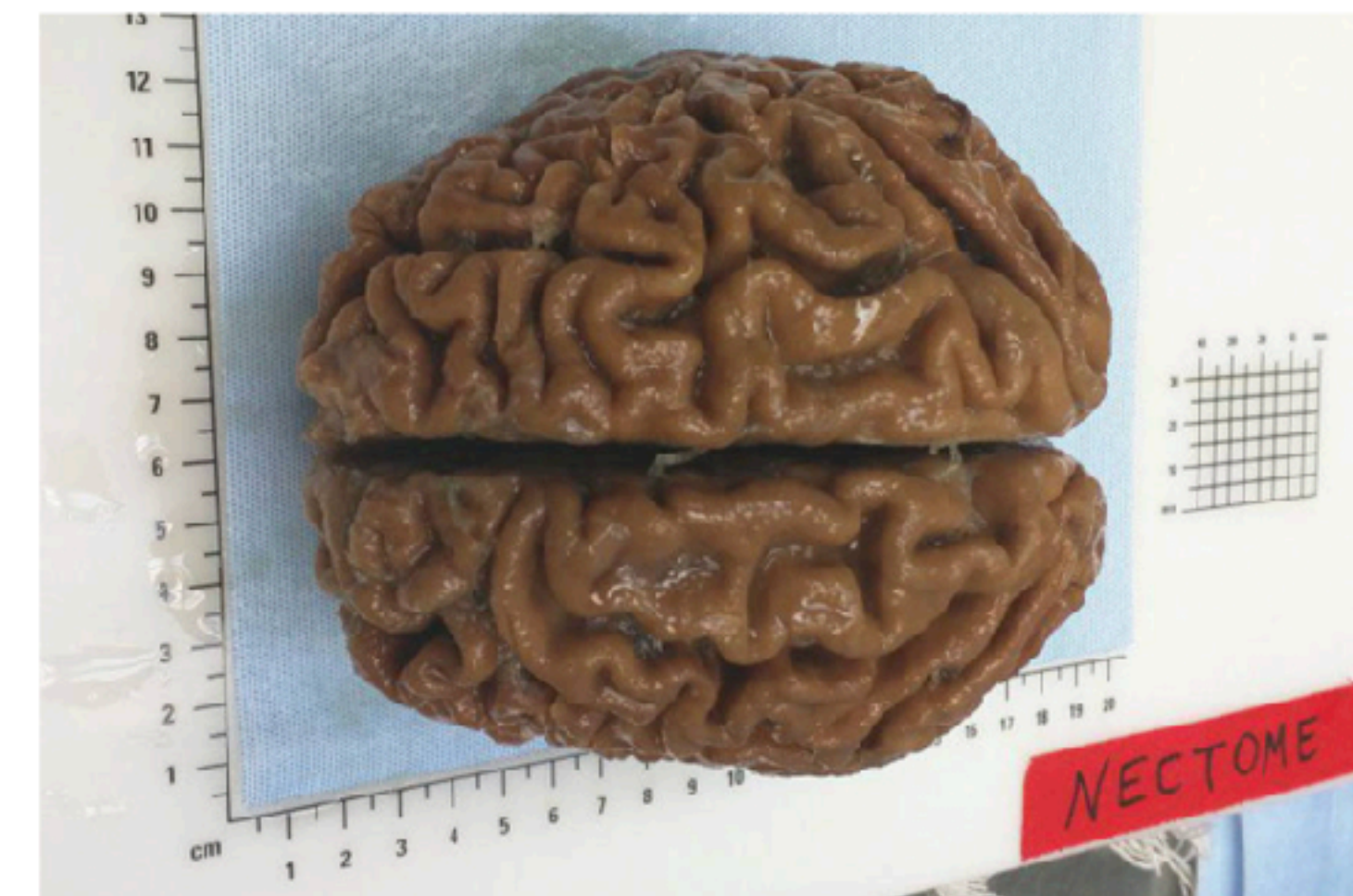
Brain Banking (Nectome, 2018)

- ▶ „Preserve your brain to bring you back in the future” & “back up your mind”
 - ▶ \$960,000 federal grant from the U.S. National Institute of Mental Health.
- ▶ Commodification of Imaginaries
 - ▶ “Any suggestion that you can come back to life is simply snake oil.”
 - Hendricks (2015)

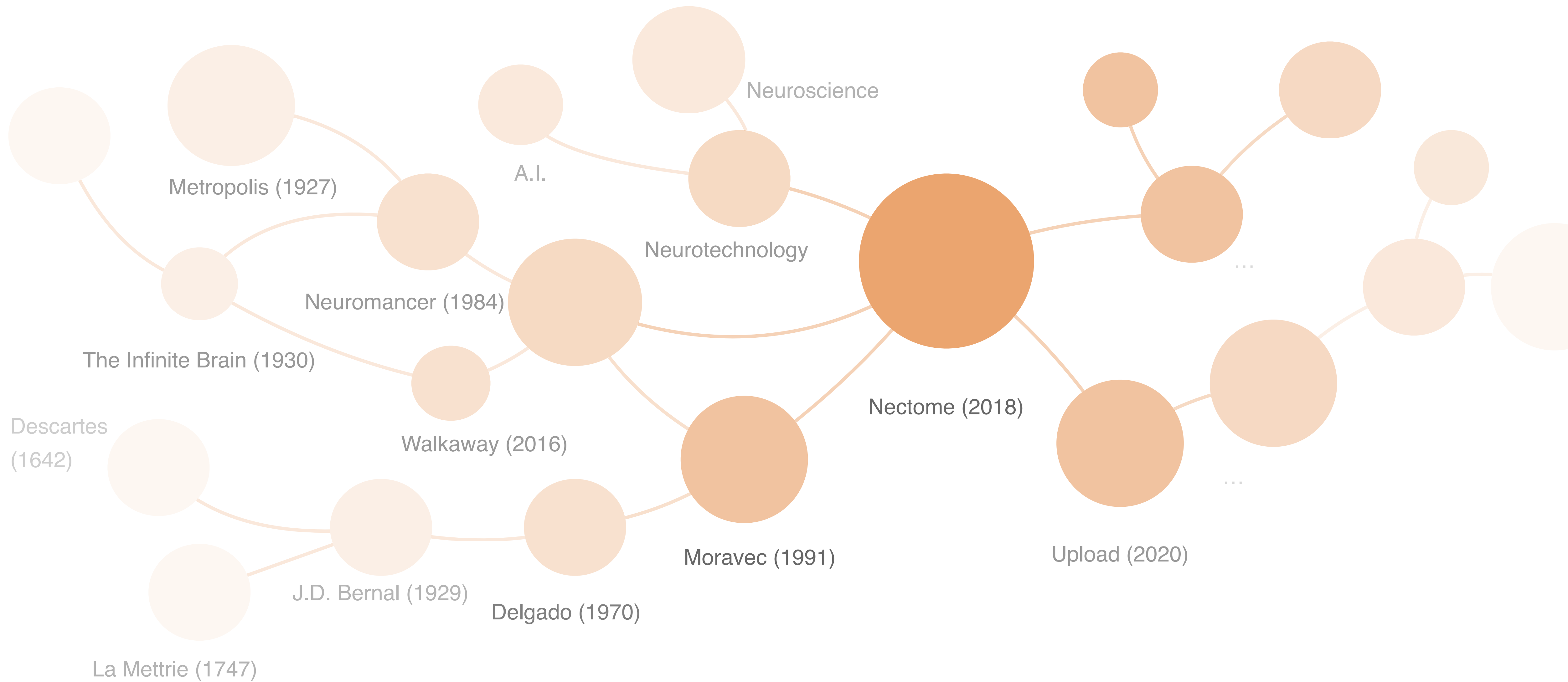

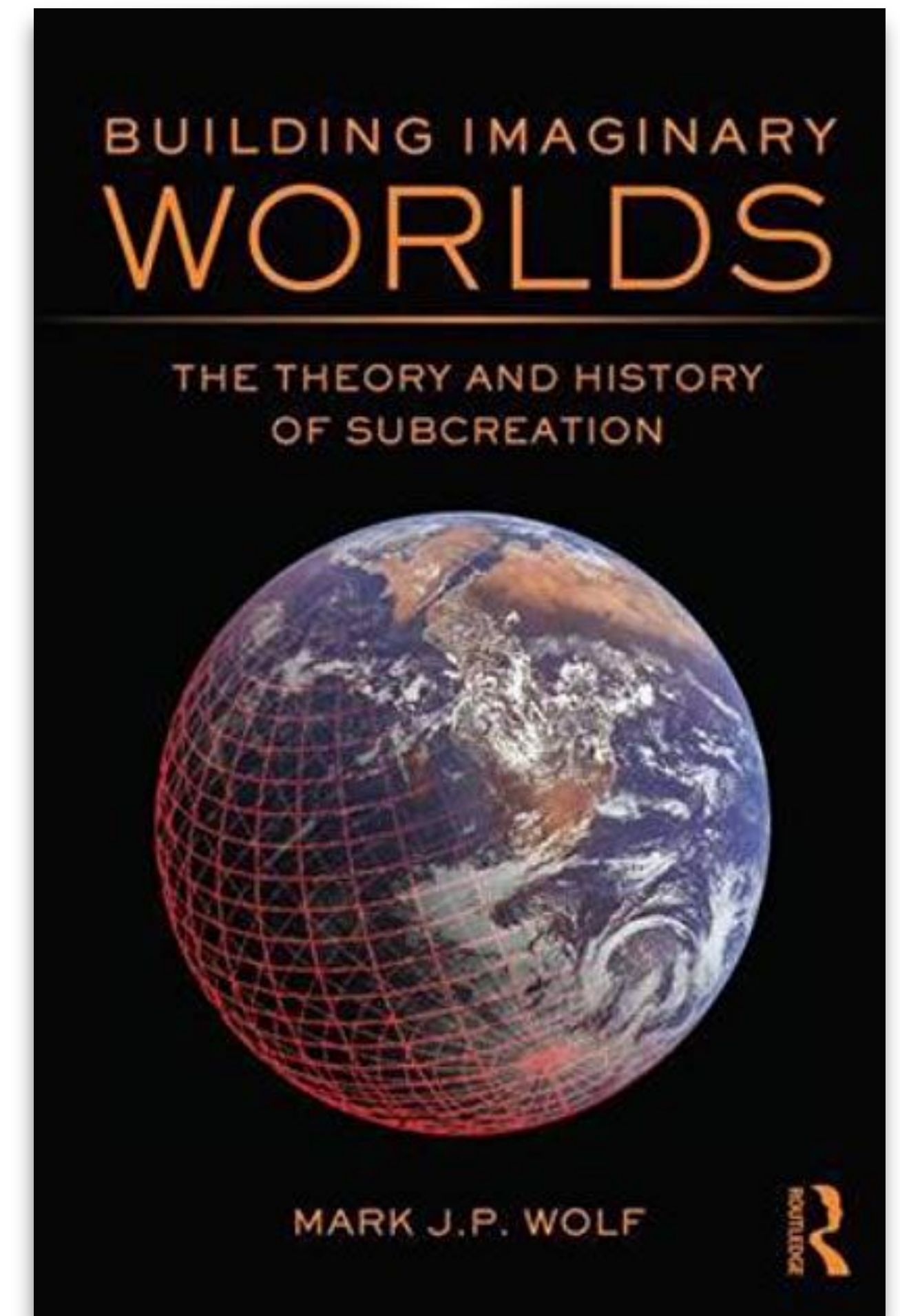
SF als Simulationsraum

- ▶ „Storyworlds can provide a ‚sandbox‘ [to] do thought experiments or prototype increasingly detailed interactions between different elements in the storyworld [and] explore emerging science and technology“ (von Stackelberg & McDowell, 2015)



Reading Storyworlds

- ▶ „While it is usually the plot-driven parts that draw the reader into the story, **it is the descriptive passages** that slow down the story to **give a deeper understanding of the world** surrounding the character. It is these descriptive passages that are at the center of an analyses of a storyworld.“



Learning to be me
(Greg Egan, 1995)

Novum: Jewel

Anfang

„I was six years old when my parents told me that there was a small, dark **jewel** inside my skull, learning to be me.

Microscopic spiders had woven a fine golden web through my brain, so that the jewel’s teacher could listen to the whisper of my thoughts. The jewel itself eavesdropped on my senses, and read the chemical messages carried in my bloodstream; **it saw, heard, smelt, tasted and felt the world exactly as I did**, while the teacher monitored its thoughts and compared them with my own. Whenever the jewel’s thoughts were wrong, the teacher — faster than thought — rebuilt the jewel slightly, altering it, this

Novum: The Switch

„**The brain is removed, discarded, and replaced** with a spongy tissue-cultured object, brain-shaped down to the level of the finest capillaries, but no more capable of thought than a lung or a kidney. This mock-brain removes exactly as much oxygen and glucose from the blood as the real thing, and faithfully performs a number of crude, essential biochemical functions. In time, like all flesh, it will perish and need to be replaced.“

„Most people underwent the switch in their early thirties. **By then, it’s downhill for the organic brain, and it would be foolish to have the jewel mimic this decline.**“

„By the time I was twenty-eight, **almost everyone I knew had switched.** All my friends from university had done it. Colleagues at my new job, as young as twenty-one, had done it. Eva, I heard through a friend of a friend, had done it six years before.“

Implikation: Kollektiver Selbstmord

„Maybe the destruction of my organic brain would be the merest hiccup, compared to all the changes that I’d been through in my life so far. **Or maybe not. Maybe it would be exactly like dying.**“

„Eva asked, ‘Does that mean you’ll never switch? You’ll have your jewel removed? You’ll let yourself die when your brain starts to rot?’

‘Maybe,’ I said. **‘Better to die at ninety or a hundred than kill myself at thirty, and have some machine marching around, taking my place, pretending to be me.’**“

Implikation: Sozialer Druck

„I drifted apart from my friends, I stopped searching for a lover. I took to working at home (I put in longer hours and my productivity rose, so the company didn't mind at all). **I couldn't bear to be with people whose humanity I doubted.**“

„Finally, **I made an appointment for the operation.** I thought, what is there to lose? Sixty more years of uncertainty and paranoia? If the human race was replacing itself with clockwork automata, I was better off dead; I lacked the blind conviction to join the psychotic underground — who, in any case, were tolerated by the authorities only so long as they remained ineffectual.“

Implikation: Fehlfunktion

„Oh, I ought to have managed, at the very least, a good, solid bout of hysterical laughter, when I realised that **I was the jewel.**“

„When I enter hospital and the switch takes place, if the nerve impulses I transmit to the body are not exactly in agreement with those from the organic brain, the flaw in the teacher will be discovered. And rectified. The organic brain has nothing to fear; his continuity will be safeguarded, treated as precious, sacrosanct. There will be no question as to which of us will be allowed to prevail. I will be made to conform, once again. I will be ‘corrected’. **I will be murdered.**“

Implikation: *Simulation* des Geistes

„As for the man who claimed that he loved her — the man who spent the last week of his life helpless, terrified, suffocated by the knowledge of his impending death — I can’t yet decide how I feel. I ought to be able to empathise — considering that I once expected to suffer the very same fate myself — yet somehow **he simply isn’t real to me**. I know my brain was modelled on his — giving him a kind of causal primacy — but in spite of that, **I think of him now as a pale, insubstantial shadow.**“

„After all, **I have no way of knowing if his sense of himself**, his deepest inner life, his experience of being, **was in any way comparable to my own.**“

„The longer I delayed, the harder the decision became. I could talk to a thousand people who had switched, I could grill my closest friends for hours about their childhood memories and their most private thoughts, but however compelling their words, I knew that the Device had spent decades buried in their heads, **learning to fake exactly this kind of behaviour.**“

Das Schiff des Theseus

„‘Suppose you had a stroke,’ I said glibly, ‘which destroyed a small part of your brain. Suppose the doctors implanted a machine to take over the functions which that damaged region had performed. Would you still be “yourself”?’ ‘Of course.’ ‘Then if they did it twice, or ten times, or a thousand times—’ ‘That doesn’t necessarily follow.’ **‘Oh? At what magic percentage, then, would you stop being you?’**“
